




## Eco-Schools Newsletter

We are hoping that approximately 3000 guests, mostly schoolchildren from across Northern Ireland, will attend so we recommend booking your tickets soon to avoid disappointment.

Eco-Schools are proud to celebrate 20 years of Eco-Schools and this landmark event provides the opportunity to recognise all the fantastic environmental projects that schools are working on. Hands-on practical workshops and inspirational activities will form a key part of the event, providing guests with a productive and motivating learning experience. There will also be numerous interactive environmental activities, performances and exhibitions.

## Operation Energy Power Down Day – 6<sup>th</sup> November 2014

More than 100 Eco-Schools in Northern Ireland have been taking part in International World Days of Action again this year with SSE Airtricity's Operation Energy Power Down Day. Schools monitored their electricity use for a week with a whole school effort to switch off and power down on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> November.



Last year schools were able to make an impressive 20% reduction in energy consumption during Power Down Day. Two Northern Ireland Schools, Cumran Primary School and Holy Cross Primary School Attical, were awarded first prize for their energy saving efforts in the Eco-Schools FEE International competition for World Days of Action.

We are looking forward to seeing the results from this year and sharing the successes shortly. ## Translink & Eco-Schools launch challenge for 'Healthier & Happier' School Run

**NI pupils join 2 week sustainable transport challenge.**

The 2014-2015 Translink Eco-Schools Travel Challenge has been launched to tackle the issue of car use and congestion around schools and boost the health and wellbeing of participants. Key Stage 1 – 3 pupils are encouraged to walk, cycle or use the bus and train for the school run. With recent independent research revealing that people who use sustainable transport for the journey to and from work have a significantly lower BMI and are happier than those who opt to use private transport, it's hoped that parents and pupils will also embrace these benefits and leave the car at home. Launching the initiative at Forge Integrated Primary School Belfast, **Translink's Lynda Shannon said:**



"We want to encourage pupils from a young age to adopt good travel habits that stay with them as they grow up and become the next generation of commuters travelling to work. As well as helping schools achieve the internationally-recognised Eco-Schools Green Flag, there are also some great challenge winner prizes up for grabs including an Ulsterbus Tours school coach trip and day out in Dublin. We're looking forward to working with local schools to tackle the school run congestion and help make life better for more families across Northern Ireland."

## Northern Ireland Schools take action to Litter Less

Tackling the tricky issue of litter is the focus of thirty local schools determined to make a difference by looking after their local environment. They have received funding from the Wrigley Jr Company Foundation to deliver a 'Litter Less' project with pupils in the school and their local communities. Keep Northern Ireland Beautiful are delighted to be delivering the campaign through the Eco-Schools Programme in partnership with the Foundation for Environmental Education.

Schools in Northern Ireland will be taking part along with schools from 27 other countries around the Globe to raise awareness of litter problems and encourage positive behaviour changes. The Campaign will form an important part of their Eco-Schools work as they go for the prestigious internationally recognized Green Flag award and will include practical actions like litter picking and waste reduction as well as a campaign to win hearts and minds in the battle against littering.

The Campaign was launched with St Mary's Primary School and St Colm's High School from Draperstown. The two schools have been working together to gather litter and to protect the environment in their schools and the local Moykeeran 'Plantin' Park. Last year they collected 22 bags of rubbish in a combined litter pick with 83 pupils taking part. This year the two schools hope to continue to work closely together on all Eco-School projects, giving their pupils the opportunity to contribute positively to maintaining an eco-friendly environment in Draperstown.



## Council and Eco-Schools Cluster Group Meetings

Eco-Schools staff were delighted to attend Cluster Group meetings organised by the following Councils during October 2014:

- **Newry & Mourne District Council** – thanks to Pat McShane for organising 2 recent events Slieve Gullion Courtyard and the Nautilus Centre in Kilkeel. These meetings were attended by a total of 37 teachers who were able to hear more about the Eco-Schools Programme as well as other organisations able to assist them with their Eco-Schools work.
- **Down District Council** – thanks to Lucinda Scott for organising this event attended by 25 teachers in Down District Council offices. The event was attended by Down DC Biodiversity Officer, Sustrans, RSPB and Trócaire representatives who were able to give teachers some valuable insight into how they can assist them with the practical application of the Eco-Schools Programme.



Both these meetings proved to be a great success with many schools registering for projects/initiatives and very positive encouragement was given by schools already involved in the Programme.

A joint Cluster Group meeting is being organised by Emma Adair for the **North Down and Ards Borough Council** areas on 19<sup>th</sup> November 2014 from 3 – 4pm at The Alderman George Green Community Centre in Bangor.
