Eco-Schools Programme

Our primary aim regarding the Eco-Schools scheme is to combine learning and action for the improvement of the environmental performance of Eco-Schools.

The programme is administered by TIDY Northern Ireland, an environmental charity in Northern Ireland, and is now also being implemented throughout the world with schools in Europe, Africa, North America, South America, Oceania and Asia.

Northern Ireland has 158 current Green Flag Schools (a further 119 schools have had Green Flags which are now lapsed) out of c12,900 flags awarded worldwide. Locally we now have 933 registered schools with c38,000 registered worldwide.

This is an opportunity to get involved with a community of schools intent on improving environmental performance.

About FEE

The Foundation for Environmental Education (FEE) is a non-governmental, non-profit organisation promoting sustainable development through environmental education (formal school education, training of staff and general awareness raising).

FEE is an international umbrella organisation with one national member organisation per country representing FEE on the national level and in charge of implementing FEE programmes nationally. FEE has members in over 50 countries worldwide.

FEE is mainly active through its five environmental education programmes: Blue Flag, Eco-Schools, Young Reporters on the Environment, Learning about Forests and Green key.

Deadline for Green Flags

The Eco-Schools team are very pleased to receive applications for Green Flag assessments at any time of year. **A deadline is set each year for Green Flag applications. This year there are 2 deadlines:**

- 11th January 2013 for assessments to be carried out before Easter break; and
- 15th March 2013 for assessments to be carried out by 21st June 2013.

Please note that no assessments will be carried out in the week commencing 24th June 2013. We would like to reassure schools that all applications will be assessed but unfortunately, due to the high volume of applications to be assessed during the summer term, we are unable to guarantee assessments before the end of June each year for applications received after the deadline date.

Big Spring Clean, April 2013

TIDY Northern Ireland is organising the Big Spring Clean campaign for the month of April 2013. Last year over 26,000 people registered



their support and this included support from 128 of our Eco-Schools so a big thank you to all those litter pickers! This



year we are hoping to involve 50,000 people in the campaign and we would actively encourage every Eco-School to register their litter pick, no matter how big or small!



The schools that registered received information on how to organise a cleanup, 20 refuse bags, a high visibility vest for the group coordinator and children's stickers. We know that many of our Eco-Schools already organise regular litter picks and this is a fantastic way to tackle the litter topic on the Eco-Schools Programme.

We would like all of our Eco-Schools to register for the Big Spring Clean. Suggested ideas include cleaning the playground, classroom, local community, local beach or other areas where litter is a problem.
