# Green Flag application guidelines 2016/17

We accept Green Flag applications at any time throughout the year however below are some deadlines for applications if you would like to be assessed before a certain time of the year:

- Pre-Easter assessment: 6th January 2017
- Summer assessment (before 23rd June): 10th March 2017

We will do our best to assess schools submitting after the suggested deadlines but may find this difficult, particularly in the summer term, which is very busy. So beat the rush and get your application in early.



#### **Please note** the preferred application method in 2016/17 is through the School Zone online system. Simply log into the Eco-Schools NI web-

site and start your online application in your School Zone. You can save your sections and return to the form at your convenience. The application will tell you if each section is completed. Once you have approved all sections a submit button will appear to send it directly to us.

Start saving your data in the Data Zone now, even if you are not going to apply this year. This interactive area helps with your Monitoring and Evaluation step and has been designed to present your data in an interesting and useful format. From 2017/18 schools applying for Green Flag will have to fill in this area for their chosen topics so familiarise yourself with it now - we hope you will enjoy it.

Be sure you start using the School Zone for collecting your data and saving your Eco-Docs in your own resource area - Data Collection, Environmental Review, Action Plan and Eco-Code. These will automatically be submitted with your online Green Flag Application.

We will still accept paper applications but please ensure you are using the new form - older formats may not be accepted by us.

# Topic of the Month: Healthy Living

It's the time of the year when many of us stay inside, eat too much and move too little. So let's all make a new year's resolution to make some healthy changes in January and put some actions into place in school too. The state of our health is related not only to our long-term physical well-being but also to emotional and social factors – our general happiness, confidence and outlook on life. There is also a clear relationship between

health and educational attainment. Children today lack active play and are bombarded with high sugar snacks and drinks. Schools play an important role in educating young people about their health, both physical and mental, and laying the groundwork for lifelong good health choices. The Healthy Living topic can look at a range of themes:

- Good diet
- **Physical activity**
- Mental health and happiness

If your school doesn't already have a healthy eating policy in place this is one area you could have a good impact on by providing a healthy break, snacks and lunches. Many Eco-Committees actually raise a little bit of money through healthy tuck shops (also think about <u>Fairtrade</u> prod-ucts). The <u>NHS recommends 60 minutes a day</u> of physical activity for children of various levels. Lots of schools have taken up the <u>Daily Mile</u> initiative. Ditching the car for the journey to school can also help - check out the <u>Translink Travel Challenge</u> and <u>Sustrans</u> resources for ideas. 'Growing up' is a challenging time for pupils and school should provide a safe space from the hectic demands of the modern world - here are some ideas on mental health from Young Minds. In a time when outdoor education is becoming increasingly important it would be a shame to lose these centres unnecessarily.
